Youth Enrichment Procedure

CHECK IN FOR ENRICHMENT CLASSES

All students must check in with the Extended Day Staff. Students will be given a snack before their class.

At the end of class, students will be escorted to the main doors of the building (Otter students will be brought to Door O). Parents should wait at the building entrance for the students.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Online registration for youth classes will close 48 hours prior to the first day of class. Any registrations after this deadline must be delivered to the Community Services office or called in, and will result in missing the first day of class. There are no prorated fees.

Refunds & Prorating

Notify Community Services & Recreation immediately if you need to withdraw from a class.

Full refunds or credits are given if a class is canceled. Refunds are not issued after a class has begun. There are no prorated fees.

To receive a refund, minus a processing fee, you must withdraw from an activity **at least 3 business days prior to the first day of the activity**.

Processing fees for classes:

- » under \$50 have a \$5 fee
- » \$50-\$149 have a \$10 fee
- » \$150-\$399 have a \$20 fee
- » \$400+ have a \$30 fee

Class Confirmation

An automatic email confirmation will be sent to you upon registration. Community Services & Recreation will contact you by telephone or email if there is a change.
