- Your background and lived experience add to the rich tapestry of our organization. We encourage all who are interested to apply and especially encourage those who represent the diverse communities our Girl Scouts live in.

What does a troop leader do?

- Meet with their troop once or twice a month for 1–2 hours.
- Create a safe and welcoming experience for every Girl Scout.
- Communicate with the parents/guardians of the troop.
- Manage troop funds and finances.
- Facilitate girl-led activities and guide Girl Scouts as they work on earning badges. (We have step-by-step instructions to help!)
- Coordinate troop activities, community service, and field trips.
