



Utilizing home care and in-home services can extend the time an individual can live in their own home. Making use of home care and in-home services can relieve stress and responsibility of family caregivers and improve the quality of life of the individual.

When more help is needed in the home, or there are medical needs after illness or hospitalization, there are a variety of home care and in-home support services available. Different types of providers serve different needs, and are paid for in different ways.

The general term home care describes two different types of care:

- Home health care provided by licensed medical professionals who offer skilled Medicare certified care including nursing, rehabilitation therapies, and medication management. Hospice care is also provided by some Medicare certified home health agencies for those nearing the end of life.
- Home care provided by professional caregivers who offer hands-on assistance with activities of daily living, including personal care such as help with bathing, dressing and toileting, and in-home support such as housekeeping, meal preparation, transportation, and shopping.

In addition, there are in-home support, homemaking or home management providers, as well as volunteer companion programs that offer other in-home support, that can help with light housekeeping and transportation.

Services vary depending on the type of home care agency, whether they are a Medicare certified agency, and what type of state licensure they have.

Skilled medical home care services such as:

- Nursing and social work
- Physical therapy and occupational therapy
- Medication administration
- Wound care

Personal care assistance with activities of daily living such as:

- Bathing and grooming
- Dressing
- Toileting

Other support services:

- Light housekeeping
- Meal preparation
- Laundry
- Transportation
- Shopping and errands

Payment also varies depending on many factors, such as acute or long term medical needs, homebound status, insurance coverage, income and asset eligibility, and personal resources.

HOME CARE: PRIVATE PAY

The following agencies are also licensed as **Comprehensive Home Care Providers** by the Minnesota Department of Health for those needing long-term care in their home. Services provided include personal care assistance with activities of daily living such as eating, bathing, dressing, using the toilet, transferring, and medication management. These providers also offer homemaking or home management services, such as assistance with light housekeeping, laundry, meal preparation, transportation, and shopping.

Private duty home care agencies bill consumers directly for their services. Rates can vary according to length and frequency of visits, income level (for those receiving county assistance such as Alternative Care), or whether the services are provided overnight. Services are typically billed on an hourly basis, often with a minimum number of hours and/or visits required in a given time period.


